"CATHOLIC TEACHING ON END-OF-LIFE CARE" -

A discussion with **FR. JOHN PARIS, PROFESSOR OF ETHICS** at Boston College, will take place here in the Lannon Chapel on **Sunday, October 30th from 11:15 – 12:15 pm**. Fr. Paris will explore the ethical, theological and legal arguments raised by the issue of withdrawal of a feeding tube and other end of life issues. **Fr. Paris recommends that parishioners read the Pastoral letter of Archbishop Jon Meyer on death and dying, "In Life and Death We are the Lord's."** Copies are available at the rectory.

THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM

Adults are baptized at the Easter Vigil as part of the Rites of Christian Initiation for Adults. Infant and child baptisms are by arrangement.

FIRST EUCHARIST

Preparation occurs in Grade 2 and includes classes, retreat and home instruction.

CONFIRMATION

Our Confirmation program begins in the 10th grade. Students are confirmed in the Spring of the 11th grade. Young adults who have been catechized but are not yet confirmed should contact the rectory for an alternative program.

MATRIMONY

Must be registered as a parishioner six months prior to beginning Marriage arrangements.

Saturdays 3:15 - 3:45 PM Upper Church or by arrangement
