Eucharist

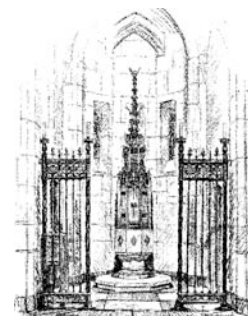

Adults are baptized at the Easter Vigil as part of the Rites of Christian Initiation for Adults. Infant and child baptisms are by arrangement.

Confirmation

Our confirmation program begins in the 10th grade. Students are confirmed in the fall of the 11th grade. Young adults who have been catechized but are not yet confirmed should contact the rectory for an alternative program.
