Our conversations will be focused this time on Timothy Radcliffe's book: *What is the Point of Being a Christian?* (N.Y.: Continuum, 2006). [It is available at *Amazon.com* and should be through local booksellers as well.] We will attempt to discuss two chapters each week.

The book has been called "a breath of fresh air at a time when such a thing is sorely needed." It asks the simple question of how our faith should be translated into action in everyday life, and what it might look like if Christians actually lived the faith we profess verbally so easily. It is a challenging and very pragmatic book.

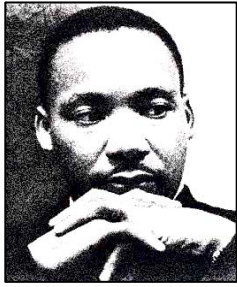
SALTATE ET JUBILATE (SJ DANCE) - SUNDAYS BEGINNING JANUARY 22ND 2:30-4:30

THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM

Adults are baptized at the Easter Vigil as part of the Rites of Christian Initiation for Adults. Infant and child baptisms are by arrangement.

FIRST EUCHARIST

Preparation occurs in Grade 2 and includes classes, retreat and home instruction.

CONFIRMATION

Our Confirmation program begins in the 9th grade. Students are confirmed in the Spring of the 10th grade. Young adults who have been catechized but are not yet confirmed should contact the rectory for an alternative program.

MATRIMONY

Must be registered as a parishioner six months prior to beginning Marriage arrangements.

RECONCILIATION

Saturdays 3:15 - 3:45 PM Upper Church or by arrangement
