### Eucharist

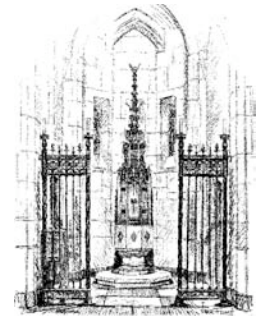

### Baptism

Adults are baptized at the Easter Vigil as part of the Rites of Christian Initiation for Adults. Infant and child baptisms are by arrangement.

### Confirmation

Our confirmation program begins in the 10<sup>th</sup> grade. Students are confirmed in the spring of the 11<sup>th</sup> grade. Young adults who have been catechized but are not yet confirmed should contact the rectory for an alternative program.
