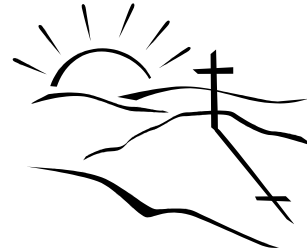

A Heritage Shared: What Chestnut Hill Has in Common with Baghdad
The Jesuit Presence in New England, Jordan and Iraq

A Conversation with Fr. Michael Linden, S.J.
New England Province Assistant for International, Pastoral and Social Ministries
Sunday, May 4th - Lower Church Friary Room - 11:15 to 12:30

The relationship between the New England Jesuits, who staff our own parish, and the people of Iraq began more than 75 years ago, with the establishment of a secondary school, and later a college, in Baghdad. Despite their expulsion when schools were nationalized in the 1960's, and despite the current war, the Jesuits have maintained their relationship with the people of Iraq through ongoing ministries serving Chaldean seminarians, Christian minorities and Iraqi refugees in Amman, Jordan and elsewhere in the Middle East. Want to find out more about the conditions and needs of millions of Iraqis displaced by war and religious persecution? Want to understand how the New England Jesuits are responding to the urgent needs for education, humanitarian relief, refugee resettlement and inter-religious dialogue in the Middle East? Wondering how we in New England might participate in and support those efforts? Join members of the St. Ignatius ARRUIPE group (Assisting Refugees Using Parish Energies) for a faith forum on the challenges and opportunities for building solidarity with the displaced people of Iraq and those serving them in Jesuit-sponsored missions in the Middle East.

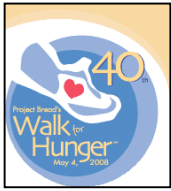

THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM

Adults are baptized at the Easter Vigil as part of the Rites of Christian Initiation for Adults. Infant and child baptisms are by arrangement.

FIRST EUCHARIST

Preparation occurs in Grade 2 and includes classes, retreat and home instruction.

CONFIRMATION

Our Confirmation program begins in the 9th grade. Students are confirmed in the Spring of the 10th grade. Young adults who have been catechized but are not yet confirmed should contact the rectory for an alternative program.

MATRIMONY

Must be registered as a parishioner six months prior to beginning Marriage arrangements.

RECONCILIATION

Saturdays 3:15 - 3:45 PM Upper Church or by arrangement
