## IMMERSION COURSE

3 credits

## CERTIFICATE IN JESUIT STUDIES

The immersion course is the first of a variety of academic offerings of the Institute's expanded Certificate in Jesuit Studies program. These courses may be taken as part of the 15-credit Certificate or may be taken for professional and personal development.

Applications are welcomed from individuals who seek a deep, informed understanding of the spirituality, history, pedagogy, and leadership methods of the Society of Jesus and its apostolates. Financial support may be available for qualified applicants.



## ONLINE AND ON-CAMPUS COURSES

3 credits each

Beginning in the fall of 2018, the Institute will offer online courses covering a range of topics, from Jesuit pedagogy to the Spiritual Exercises. The Institute can also facilitate participation in courses in the field of Jesuit Studies offered on the Boston College campus.



## LEADERSHIP SEMINAR

3 credits

In this hybrid course, online readings and discussions exploring contemporary leadership theories complement a week-long seminar at Boston College. Enrollment is restricted to those who have already completed four other courses.
