After a long struggle for independence from Portugal, the people of Mozambique slipped into a bloody civil war that lasted 16 years, killing over a million people and sending another 4.5 million fleeing for refuge. Archbishop Gonçaves was one of the first mediators who successfully brokered peace in Mozambique. This peace has been enduring now for over 15 years. Archbishop and Prof. Andrea Bartoli of Sant'Egidio will speak about the Mozambican peace process.
