STRONG WOMEN, STRONG GIRLS PROGRAM EXPANDS!


Fifty Allston Brighton elementary age girls are on their way to becoming strong women! The Boston College chapter of Strong Women, Strong Girls (SWSG) currently has six mentoring groups at the following sites: the Hamilton, Winship, Garfield and St. Columbkille Schools and at the West End Boys & Girls Club. Eighteen BC undergraduate women meet weekly with third, fourth and fifth graders in curriculum and activity based small groups. Strong Women, Strong Girls, a national organization, seeks to empower young women and girls through "an innovative after school model that uses the study of contemporary and historic female role models, mentoring relationships and skill building activities to help at-risk girls in grades 3-5 build positive selfesteem and skills for life-long success."

This past fall, the Boston College chapter hosted a field trip on the BC campus for girls participating in the program. They spent a Saturday touring the campus, meeting women from the BC soccer team, doing arts and crafts and having fun!

The Boston College Chapter of SWSG furthers the Neighborhood Center's mission in the Allston-Brighton neighborhoods by engaging Boston College undergraduate students in a creative way with its surrounding community.

READ BOSTON PROGRAM

The Boston College Neighborhood Center's **Read Boston program**, a federally funded work-study children's literacy program, has added a fourth site partners! Thirty BC students work in the classroom one on one or with small groups of children at four schools in the Allston Brighton community. We have worked for several years in the **Hamilton and Winship Schools** but last January added the **Jackson Mann Elementary School** and this past fall added **St. Columkille's School**. We are thrilled to have expanded our partnership!

ONE-ON-ONE TUTORING PROGRAM

Over **50 families and 80 children are** enrolled in the BC Neighborhood Center's **free Tutoring Program**. Children are matched one on one with a Boston College volunteer for a once a week session. The tutoring/mentoring occurs on the Boston College campus. Many parents have reported back positive results on their children's report cards/study habits and confidence levels as a result of the time spent with their BC tutor. We're thrilled to receive the great feedback that the program has a strong impact.

SERVICE DAYS

Each semester, hundreds of BC students volunteer in the Allston Brighton community. On Saturdays this past fall, BC's Appalachia Volunteers worked with the following organizations: Brighton Main Streets, Charlesview Apartments, Covenant House, Commonwealth Housing Development, Boston Public Library—Faneuil Branch, Oak Square YMCA, St. Columbkille Church, and Veronica B.
