Members of all classes and majors are welcome at the Fair. While most employers planning to attend are Boston-based, there will be out-of-state companies represented, so make sure to stop by. A variety of career fields will also

be represented, so the Fair will be a great place to explore different options.

Internship Profile: Katherine Cannella, A&S '08

This summer I was a **corporate relations intern for the American Cancer Society** in their Manhattan office. It was a great opportunity, offering an inside look at how the nation's largest nonprofit organization functions. The society has a large community presence, as I myself had experienced by participating in its Relay for Life in my hometown. The ACS also, however, deals with local businesses and corporations, offering them the chance to pro-

mote its message of cancer awareness to their employees. My position allowed me to help the ACS reach out to these Manhattan firms and foster corporate relations, such as in a campaign extending invitations to the annual October walking event Making Strides Against Breast Cancer. I was also fortunate enough to get a look at how the other departments within the nonprofit worked, especially special events, as I volunteered at the Making Strides kick-off

breakfast for the event's corporate participants. On the more managerial side of things, one project was to compile a database that analyzed corporate giving over the past fiscal year, and another was to help reorganize account records. The opportunities available to an intern vary according to the department's needs at the time, but one of the more valuable lessons one can walk away with is that of a good understanding of how a nonprofit organization works.

To apply to interview for a specific job, submit your résumé and other required documents by November 26. Employers will contact you if you've been selected to interview. You can also network at the event from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m., and if you're lucky, an em-

ployer will occasionally add people to their interview schedule. **Boston's CIC event will be held on January 7**, and other forums will be held in Chicago on January 3, Washington, D.C., on January 4, New York City on January 9, and San Francisco on January 11.

Steamboat Foundation Sponsors NY Giants Internship

The Steamboat Foundation is dedicated to mentoring tomorrow's leaders today through their Summer Scholars program. Juniors who qualify for financial aid are encouraged to apply for this program, which places a Boston College student in a 10-

week summer internship with the New York Giants. **The student will receive a \$12,000 grant, attend leadership dinners in New York City, and gain invaluable work experience in the Giants' front office.** The Scholar will be placed in the Public Rela-

tions or Community Relations office. The application process begins in late November, so be sure to check your e-mail and EagleLink for updates. An information session featuring past Steamboat Scholars is tentatively scheduled for November 28.

NEW YORK GIANTS (STEAMBOAT FOUNDATION) — New York

The unique Steamboat Summer Scholar Program places a Boston College student who has just completed his or her junior year in a 10-year internship with the New York Giants. This intern will work in the Giants' Marketing and Sales department, contribute to the Giants youth program, receive mentoring from the team's Director of Marketing and Youth Programs, attend regular social events, and meet every other week at a restaurant for a structured discussion with a leadership coach. Summer Scholars also receive a \$12,000 stipend. Check EagleLink in mid-November for the application.
