Internship Resource of the Week: How to Receive Academic Credit for An Internship



Found an internship you would love to take but it doesn't pay? Ask if you can get credit for it instead! Many internships are available for up to three credits—the equivalent of a semester long course! How to go about getting credit depends on your school.

Both Arts & Sciences and the School of Management offer one-credit internship course. To apply for credit, students need to first contact their department and then the appropriate Associate Dean's Office. Certain departments within A&S and CSOM also offer three-credit internship seminars. These seminars generally include a regular meeting with an instructor or faculty advisor to discuss different aspects of your work experience in the context of a set of analytical readings. How to set up these seminars vary by department. Contact your academic advisor for more information.

A third option is to incorporate your internship into your academic program through the development of a Readings and Research course. Readings and Research courses must be approved by a faculty member and the academic department.

With the BC Nonprofit Summer Internship Grant, you get to follow your passion AND get paid! Please note this is only for students who have completed their junior year at BC.

Help Yourself and Others! Become a Peer Advisor Intern

Perfect your interviewing skills. Learn to write professional resumes. Build your leadership abilities. Help fellow students! These are the simple goals of the peer advisor program at the Boston College Career Center.



Peer Advisors provide assistance to undergraduate students; lead resume/cover letter writing workshops and interview workshops; critique resumes and cover letters; conduct practice interviews; and orient other students to the services of the Career Center. The internship is three hours of time in the Career Center weekly and a one hour weekly staff meeting. Through this experience you are able to help others and gain knowledge for your own internship and job searches.
