Welcome to Great Britain

hile its lush, green countryside is full of historical remnants such as Stonehenge and Hadrian's Wall, Great Britain's cities combine elements of its past with modern culture, architecture, and ethnic diversity. As the home of Shakespeare, Robert Burns, the Houses of Parliament, and The Beatles, this island offers a myriad of opportunities to delve into the past and explore contemporary life in a variety of settings.

Boston College students wishing to spend a semester or year in Great Britain have many options. BC study abroad locations include London, one of the largest and most culturally diverse

cities in Europe, as well as smaller cities where students can easily integrate into local and university life. Students can choose from programs at large, comprehensive institutions with a broad discipline range, such as the University of Glasgow, or smaller, more tailored programs at the School of Oriental and African Studies (SOAS) in London or the Advanced Studies in England (ASE) program in Bath. Level of immersion varies, from larger institutions offering full immersion into a British university, to smaller schools providing more individualized attention. No matter what students' academic and personal interests entail, they will find a suitable program in Great Britain.



BATH

Located ninety minutes west of London, Bath is considered one of England's architectural treasures. Bisected by the river Avon, this beautiful city has much to offer including its famous Roman baths, museums, galleries, pubs, restaurants, and music of all kinds.

Designed for U.S. undergraduates, Advanced Studies in England (ASE) is a liberal arts program associated with University College, Oxford. Students receive individual attention from ASE staff and distinguished faculty who teach small classes. This program is especially suited for students interested in English, history, political science, and education. Housing is in historic townhouses.

DURHAM

Famous for its beautiful castle and cathedral. which are a World Heritage Site, Durham's history spans over a thousand years. The city is located approximately four hours from London and fifteen miles from Newcastle, and has a population of about 45,000. The university is in the pedestrian-friendly center of town.


The Program

Founded in 1832, the University of Durham is the third oldest university in England and is considered one of the best British universities. Many of its 27 academic departments rank in the top five in the country, and the university offers many undergraduate programs. Academic strengths include English, economics, history, accounting, finance, chemistry, philosophy, and theology. BC students are fully integrated into university courses and life, and are housed in one of the colleges.

GLASGOW

Once known as "The Second City of the British Empire," Glasgow is the best-preserved Victorian city in Great Britain and has emerged as one of its liveliest urban centers. Named a "European City of Culture" in 1990 and the European Community's "City of Architecture and Design" in 1999, this city offers outstanding cultural and recreational opportunities and close proximity to the Scottish Highlands.

Founded in 1451, the University of Glasgow offers a broad range of disciplines and is at the forefront of educational innovation. Over 20,000 students attend the university, including 2000 from abroad. Of particular interest to BC students are programs in the arts and humanities, the sciences, and management. BC students are fully integrated into university courses and life, and are housed in either residence halls or student houses.

LANCASTER

A short distance from the Lake District and Manchester, and three hours from London and Edinburgh, Lancaster is renowned for its spectacular scenery. With a population of 50,000, this city is full of history, culture, and attractions including museums, theater, a covered market, medieval architecture, and pubs.

Lancaster University is located five kilometers from the city center and has 11,000 students studying in over thirty academic departments. Of particular interest to BC students are programs in management, premedical studies, communication, creative writing, and environmental science. BC students are fully integrated into university courses and life, and reside in single rooms at one of eight undergraduate colleges.

LIVERPOOL

With 450,000 inhabitants, Liverpool is a student-friendly city known for its maritime history and The Beatles. As a "European Capital of Culture 2008," it is one of Britain's most ethnically diverse cities and a leader in learning, culture, entertainment, sports, and economic growth. The city's Merseyside area and Albert Dock boast a myriad of museums, theaters, galleries, shops, and restaurants.

Approximately 18,000 students attend the university, with 2000 from abroad. BC students are fully integrated into university courses and life, and reside in local student accommodations.

LONDON

One of the world's largest and most dynamic cities, London is a thriving cultural, economic, and political center with a diverse population of about seven million. The city encompasses a variety of historic, commercial, and residential areas, with neighborhoods that have retained a distinct character and strong community feel. London's street markets, parks, galleries, historic sites, and waterfront offer contrasting views of a vibrant city.

The Program

BC students take courses at one of the following six universities and are fully integrated into university life. Students reside in university residence halls or local apartments. An on-site coordinator organizes monthly BC activities.
