Known for our academically rigorous and in-depth clinical program, we both challenge and prepare students to integrate evidence-based interventions and culturally competent practice with individuals, couples, families, and groups. We offer students the opportunity to learn effective interventions such as Cognitive Behavior Therapy, Solution Focused Therapy, Narrative Therapy, Internal Family Systems, Dialectical Behavior Therapy, Psychodynamic Therapy, Play Therapy, Couples Therapy, Family Therapy, and Group Therapy. With an emphasis on resiliency and empowerment, we offer courses in trauma treatment for adults and children. Utilizing the expertise of a dynamic, interdisciplinary faculty, new course offerings focus on neuroscience, public health, Latino populations, and working with refugees and immigrants. The combination of clinical course work and field placements enables students to refine their clinical practice skills in preparation for their professional careers.
