

Common Reciprocity Questions

Please note: Reciprocity is available after your 1L year

1. What is reciprocity?

Reciprocity allows law students to visit other law school's Career Services Office. Services vary among law schools, but most offer use of their facilities, resource libraries, job listings and employment bulletins. Reciprocity does not allow access to on-campus interviews or individual career counseling.

2. How do I obtain reciprocity?

After your 1L year, you obtain reciprocity through our Career Services Office. Email law.career@bc.edu with your name, school year, and the school (and an alternate school) for which you would like us to request reciprocity. We will make a request and let you know if the school has granted it.

3. May I have reciprocity from more than one school?

No. You may have reciprocity from one school at a time, during a three month period.

4. How long does reciprocity last?

Reciprocity lasts for three months. Reciprocity, however, is closed during the fall recruiting season, which runs from August 1 until November 15th.

5. Will I have on-line access to job postings?

Each law school has their own specific policy. Some schools do allow on-line access to Symplicity, but many schools do not allow access. Research the school's reciprocity policy in advance to find out what services they offer.

6. If I cannot view job postings on-line, how can I see them?

For schools that do not offer on-line access, **you must visit** the school's Career Services Office. Schools will have copies of the job postings in their office.
