The Lynch School offers Curriculum and Instruction (C&I) programs at both master's and doctoral levels. Designed for classroom teachers in the United States and beyond, C&I programs at Boston College advance knowledge in your current licensure area, or prepare you to lead in a new area of interest.

Students at the Lynch School conduct real-world research in collaboration with faculty, teachers, counselors, parents, administrators, service providers, and others. They participate in professional development and learn about school policy and change, literacy, special needs, and assessment. They approach their work with a concern for social justice and they prepare to effect change and inform public policy.
