

GEOFFREY T. BOISI

Chairman and Chief Executive Officer, Roundtable Investment Partners LLC

Geoffrey T. Boisi '69, P'11, is chairman and CEO of Roundtable Investment Partners LLC, an independent private investment partnership providing strategic advice and planning, investment management, and merchant banking services for families of substantial wealth as well as select institutions generating high performance wealth creation and social legacy-building opportunities.

For more than three decades, Mr. Boisi has worked tirelessly to advance the mission of Boston College. A 27-year member of the Boston College Board of Trustees, Mr. Boisi served as chairman from 1993 to 1996 and is now a trustee associate. He is the founding sponsor of the Boisi Center for Religion and American Public Life, a co-founder and chair *emeritus* of the Wall Street Council, and was co-chair of the *Ever to Excel* capital campaign for Boston College.

Mr. Boisi retired in 2003 as vice chairman of JPMorgan Chase, where he served as co-CEO of JPMorgan, the firm's commercial and investment bank. Prior to joining JPMorgan Chase, Mr. Boisi was founding chairman and senior partner of The Beacon Group, a premier merger and acquisition advisory and private investment firm acquired by Chase in 2000. Before that, Mr. Boisi was a senior general partner and head of global investment banking at Goldman, Sachs & Co. During his 22 years at Goldman Sachs, he held numerous positions, including chairman of strategic planning, co-chair of the international management committee, partner in charge of global finance, head of investment banking services, and partner in charge of mergers and acquisitions.

Mr. Boisi is deeply committed to numerous nonprofit organizations. In 1989, he co-founded MENTOR/National Mentoring Partnership, which is leading the movement to connect America's young people with caring adult mentors. He is an overseer of the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania; a trustee of the Carnegie Corporation of New York and The Brookings Institution; an honorary trustee of Yale University's Saint Thomas More Chapel and Center; a member of the James Madison Council of the Library of Congress and the Founders' Circle of America's Promise; a director of Oxford Analytica and FADICA; and a Knight of Malta. Mr. Boisi also serves the Catholic Church as chairman and founding board member of the National Leadership Roundtable on Church Management (NLRCM).

He has served as chairman of the graduate executive board of the Wharton School and co-chair of its capital campaign; a trustee of the Papal Foundation and Friends Academy; a member of the international advisory board of Grupo Santander (Spain), the American Stock Exchange's investment banking committee, the board of directors of Freddie Mac, and the Trilateral Commission; and a director of Park Agency, Inc. (formerly Joseph P. Kennedy Enterprises), and Communities in Schools.

Among the many awards Mr. Boisi has received honoring his nonprofit leadership are the Wharton School's Joseph Wharton Award, the American Red Cross of Greater New York's Humanitarian Award, the Cancer Research Institute's Oliver R. Grace Award for Distinguished Service in Advancing Cancer Research, Chaminade High School's Distinguished Alumnus Award, and the National Catholic Educational Association's Elizabeth Seton Award. He was honored by Pope John Paul II as a Steward of St. Peter. He is also the recipient of an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree from Sacred Heart University as well as the 2006 Lewis Hine Distinguished Service Award for outstanding service on behalf of children.

Mr. Boisi earned an MBA from the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania. He and his wife, Rene Isacco Boisi '69, count 18 graduates of Boston College among their family members, including one of their four sons, John '11.
