3. The National Football League (NFL) is looking for students to participate in their **NFL Summer Internship Program** in New York

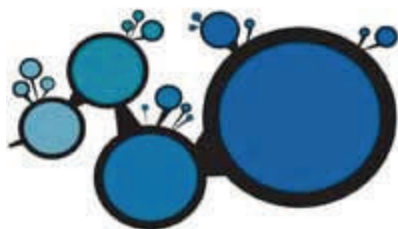

If one person knows how to make a difference in this world, it's Meg Battle. Meg spent last summer teaching English and working on community-related issues in Battambang, Cambodia. Though it was a challenging experience for her, she never stops smiling when she speaks about her time there. After graduation, Meg plans on returning to Cambodia to direct a newly established women's health center that will address

issues ranging from healthy living practices to domestic violence. Meg says that her time in Cambodia this summer helped to solidify her decision to return post-graduation.

Meg received a non-profit internship grant through the Boston College Career Center which helped to fund her internship experience in Cambodia. **Five** Stipends of **\$3,200** will be available to juniors who plan to do unpaid summer internships in a not-for-profit field dealing with social and human services.

If this is an opportunity that you might be interested in, start looking for a non-profit internship now. Once you have found an internship, you can begin your

proposal process. The applications will be available mid-March and are not due until early April.
