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Five Non-Profit Grants Awarded

Five Boston College juniors who will be completing unpaid summer internships in the fields of social and human services were recently chosen from a competitive group of applicants to receive the Career Center's Non-Profit/Human Service Grants. Each student will be awarded \$3,200.

Meghan Battle of Concord, Mass., an LSOE junior, will be working for the Arrupe Center at the Battambang Apostolic Prefecture in Battambang, Cambodia. Her primary responsibilities will be helping to run free public health clinics and teaching at the Center, which serves as a home for children and adoles-

cents who were disabled from landmine accidents or polio.

Natalie Foy-Claycomb, an A&S junior from Pacifica, Calif., will be working for the Bay Area Legal Aid-Domestic Violence Restraining Order Clinic in San Mateo, Calif. She will help provide legal advice to victims of domestic abuse.

Lauren Galinsky of Madison, Conn., a junior in A&S, will be working for the MicroLoan Foundation in Cambridge, Mass. She will create educational outreach programs for U.S. schools on the topic of global poverty, especially in Malawi. With her grant money, she

will be able to travel to Malawi to see how programs are implemented.

Rudi Julius, an A&S junior from Pembroke Pines, Fla., will intern for the Community Family Center in Lauderhill, Fla. She will be teaching children from Haiti and members of other migrant groups whose first language is not English.

Chris Rall of St. Louis, Mo., a CSOM student, will work for the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod in Papua New Guinea. He will help build an airstrip and provide local HIV/AIDS awareness to primary and secondary schools.

The Financial Women's Association is delighted to present the Wall Street Exchange (WSE) Summer Program. **WSE is a career development program designed to augment the summer internship experience of women between their junior and senior years of college who are completing finance internships in New York City.**

The WSE is an exciting chance for participants to enhance their job search skills while learning to think strategically about

career choices. The program consists of eight weekly events designed to strengthen the skills necessary to complete a successful full-time post-graduation job search in financial services or related fields. Topics covered in the past have included résumé-writing, interviewing, business etiquette, and more. The opening reception is scheduled for June 17, and the closing ceremony will take place on August 6.

To qualify for participation in the WSE, an appli-

cant must have an interest in exploring careers in finance and business and a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0. Applicants must have completed their junior year in college and secured a summer internship position in the New York City area with a financial services company or have a financial position with a non-financial services company. Funding Available for HR Summer Internships

The Society for Human Resource Management (SHRM) Board of Directors recently announced the availability of funding to support HR internships. Students studying HR at the undergraduate or graduate level are invited to apply for funding to help support themselves during a summer of fall 2008 HR internship. This financial support underscores SHRM's

commitment to the next generation of HR professionals by providing an opportunity for students to take advantage of internships that will help them prepare for their career.

Eight sponsorships of \$5,000 each will be awarded in each of SHRM's five geographic regions. Each selected student will receive half of his or her funding during the first week of the in-

ternship, and the other half upon completion of the role.

Applications are being accepted now through April 30. Awards will be announced in June for summer internships and in August for fall internships.
