- Mission: In unity, the mission of the Asian Caucus is to act as the voice, resource, and support for the Asian / Asian American students at Boston College and to promote cultural diversity and awareness within the Boston College community.
- Description: As the head of the umbrella organization for the 10 Asian cultural clubs on campus, organized and produced various cultural, educational and social events throughout the year. Events varied from racial awareness forums, annual retreat, Asian cultural shows to a multi-racial fashion show.
- Skills: Developed group organizational skills, meeting management, public speaking skills, mentored students, networked with various cultural groups, faculty and administration.
- Hours a Week: Minimum of four hours, for two semesters

Activity 2: International Assistant Program: International Assistant and Coordinator

- Description: Familiarized incoming International students with Boston College/American customs at International Student Orientation and acted as a mentor to individual students throughout the academic year.
- Skills: Management of multiple cultures and event programming.
- Hours a Week: thirty-five hours for orientation. One hour a week, six semesters.

Activity 3: Japan Club of Boston College: Freshman representative for the 1996-1997 academic school year.

- Description: Organized and promoted Japanese culture through various programs extending from a sushi workshop, Japanese language table, jazz performance to a weekly film showing.
- Skills: Bilingual usage of Japanese and English, group organization and networking.
- Hours a Week: two hours a week, two semesters

Service Project: Community Change Inc., Civil Rights Intern

- Description: Summer intern, assisted the directors in the coordination and organization of workshops, conferences and general office work, organized and took part in workshops designed to heighten knowledge on civil rights issues and racial awareness
- Skills: Use of database (Filemaker Pro 4.0), networking, and general office work
- Hours a Week: thirty-two hours a week for three months
