III. Co-curricular Activities

Activity 1: Diversity Council Group Member

September 2000 – December 2001

- Description: Coordinated events relating to the promotion of pluralism with the goal of enlightening students on various cultural perspectives.
- Skills: Team work, time management, used knowledge of cultural diversity to suggest and facilitate events.
- Time Commitment: Approximately 3 hours a week for 2 semesters.

Activity 2: Nicaragua Immersion Experience

September 1999 – May 2000

- Description: 10 day trip to Nicaragua to be educated on issues of oppression, social justice and faith. Worked to reconcile critical reflection with action while interacting with others in the group and natives.
- Skills: Team work, communication skills, empathy, helping others and opening myself up to be helped by others.
- Time Commitment: 2 hours per week for 13 weeks for trip preparation, and 10 days in Nicaragua.

Activity 3: Resident Assistant for MOSAIC (Multicultural) Floor

September 2000 – December 2001

- Description: Worked with a team to counsel residents in matters of social, academic and multicultural needs. Enhanced the residents' awareness of multicultural, social and educational issues by creating space for interaction. Encouraged residents to comply with university housing policies.
- Skills: Leadership, team work, assertiveness, counseling, conflict resolution, creativity.
- Time Commitment: Daily for academic year.

Service Project: Volunteer, St. Egidio Society

September 1999 – May 2000

- Description: Volunteered at the Commonwealth Tenants Association for the elderly. Worked through language and cultural barriers to assist the elderly with chores and spiritual needs.
- Skills: Communicating with non-English speaking people; developed both listening and mediation skills.
- Time Commitment: Approximately 3 hours a week for 13 weeks.
