Activity 1: International Assistant & Steering Committee Member September 1999 – May 2000

- Skills: Organizational and planning skills, cross-cultural understanding, French language.
- Time Commitment: Approx. 3 hours a week for academic year, plus 7-day intensive training and orientation in August.

Activity 2: Peer Advisor, CIPP September 2001 – December 2001

- Description: Worked with the Boston College Center for International Partnerships and Programs (CIPP) to advise students going abroad. Helped the students research destinations and provided assistance with the application process
- Skills: Research, counseling, advising, communications.
- Time Commitment: 3 hours a week for the semester.

Activity 3: Intern, Eaton Consulting Group September 2001 – December 2001

- Description: Worked in a cross-cultural consulting firm to contact consultants for the company. Assisted in seminars and trainings on how to conduct business and effectively communicate in other cultures.
- Skills: Research, communication with other cultures, summary and report producing.
- Time Commitment: 12 hours a week for the semester.

**Service Project: Participant and Facilitator for the ELP September 1998 – May 1999;
September 2001 – May 2002**

- Description: Worked with the Emerging Leader Program (ELP) team to learn and develop leadership skills. Performed weekly community service projects in the greater Boston area. Worked with the AIDS/HIV community, a shelter for women and people living in low-income housing, all constituencies were from various ethnic backgrounds. As a Facilitator, provided assistance to freshmen in helping them acclimate to the program.
