**Activity 1: Volunteer, Service Trip; Nicaragua**

**January-March 2004**

- Description: Traveled with a group of ten Boston College students to San Juan Del Sur in Nicaragua. Prepared in weekly meetings to learn about the culture and history of Nicaragua. Lived with host family, taught English to a sixth grade class, painted a mural on a school library, traveled to the countryside and distributed library books to local children. Developed an understanding of this small beach town community in Nicaragua. Connected experiences with the community in nightly reflections and discussions.
- Skills: Improved Spanish language skills. Utilized teaching and interpersonal skills.
- Time Commitment: 2 ½ hours per week for 6 weeks; 10 day trip

**Activity 2: Peer Advisor, Center for International Partnerships and Programs**

**September-December 2003**

- Description: Advised an international student from Ecuador. Helped him adjust to life at Boston College and the United States.
- Skills: Demonstrated maturity while working with other students. Utilized communication and organizational skills.
- Time Commitment: 3 hours per week for 15 weeks

**Activity 3: Volunteer, La escuela secundaria Mariana de Jesús; Quito, Ecuador**

**September 2002-May 2003**

- Description: Worked with students at a school for blind and deaf students in Quito, Ecuador. Helped students with homework and organized after-school activities.
- Skills: Improved Sign Language skills and non-verbal communication. Developed a better understanding for children with disabilities.
- Time Commitment: 6 hours per week for 30 weeks

**Service Project: PULSE Volunteer, Haitian Multi-Service Center**

**September 2001-May 2002**

- Description: Worked as an English teacher and day care aide at the Haitian Multi-Service Center in Boston. Worked with Haitian immigrants of all ages.
- Skills: Developed teaching skills and improved cross-cultural communication. Learned to connect experiences in placement to course work through reflection.
