**August 2003-May 2005**

Served as a member of the Steering Committee to select new participants during the 2003-2004, and 2004-2005 school years. Served as a program coordinator for the 2004-2005 school year.

**Activity 2: Leader, Haiti Spring Break Service Trip;**

**October 2004-March 2005**
