**Activity 1: International Assistant, Office of International Students and Scholars**

*September, 2003- May, 2007*

- Description: Elected as the President for 2006-2007; Chaplain in 2004-2005. The choir performs at various events around campus and in the Boston area. Served as president of the 12 member board which includes planning the extensive annual tour and coordinating the schedule and activities of the choir. Increased awareness of the history of Gospel music and African-American music on campus.
- Skills: Developed management skills leading a team of 12 people to govern the affairs of the choir weekly. Deepened appreciation for the inclusion of all cultures.
- Time Commitment: 12 hours per week

**Activity 3: Social Justice Program; Santiago, Chile**

*December, 2004- January, 2005*

- Description: Participated in inaugural winter abroad program for Boston College. The program included one 3-credit course with professors from Boston College, Universidad Alberto Hurtado, and accredited lawyers from around Santiago closely involved in the Agosto Pinochet case. The course focused on liberation theology and the success of the Solidaridad program in South America.
- Skills: Developed strong cross-cultural communication skills and an appreciation for the global society.
- Time Commitment: 5 hours classroom work and 5 hours field research, 5 days per week for 3 weeks

**Service Project: Volunteer, Counselor; Youth Opportunity Boston**

*September, 2004- May, 2005*
