VISITING STUDENT FACT SHEET

The following information is designed to address the concerns most frequently voiced by Visiting Students. Additional information is available in the on-line Student Guide at www.bc.edu/advancingstudies

VISITING STUDENT STATUS

Not only part-time Boston College undergraduates register through the Woods College of Advancing Studies, but the Woods College of Advancing Studies also acts as host to all visiting undergraduates. Persons wishing to attend Boston College on a part-time basis during the day apply for visiting student status. This category also encompasses undergraduates from other institutions wishing to study full-time for credit in day courses. Since undergraduate credits are not transferable to a graduate school, persons who already have a bachelor's degree should consider applying as a Special Student in the graduate school, although they are eligible to apply as a Visiting Student.

REGISTRATION

Visiting Students register for their day program through the Woods College of Advancing Studies at the beginning of each semester. After picking up the necessary registration forms in McGuinn 100, a student's admission to specific courses is authorized by department chairpersons on an individual basis during the registration period on a space-available basis. Once signatures have been obtained, students return to the Woods College of Advancing Studies where payment is made. No advanced billing is done.

Confirmation of Registration does not apply to Visiting Students.

HOUSING

At present, the limited housing facilities are restricted to full-time Boston College degree students. However, the Housing Office does provide a list of off-campus residences. If you need assistance in this area, contact the Housing Office directly. (617-552-3075)

HEALTH INSURANCE

Massachusetts State Law has mandated that all students taking three or more courses must be covered by medical insurance providing a specified minimum coverage. Students have the option of participating in the Boston College plan or submitting a waiver form. The waiver includes specific insurance information. Students who do not submit a waiver will be automatically billed \$738 for the Fall semester and \$940 for the Spring semester for the Massachusetts Medical Insurance.

IMMUNIZATION

All students planning to enroll must submit to Boston College Health Services proof of immunization against measles, mumps, rubella, diphtheria and tetanus **and** either a waiver for or proof of vaccination for meningococcal disease.
