In keeping with the 1995 General Congregation of the Society of Jesus' initiatives on interreligious dialogue, the U.S. Jesuit Assistency for Mission and Interreligious Dialogue and the Boston College Theology Department announce their fifth annual student conference in the areas of comparative theology, interreligious dialogue, theology of religions, and missiology.

This conference is open to graduate students at Jesuit institutions and other schools of higher education. Advanced undergraduate students are invited to submit proposals along with a letter of recommendation from a faculty member.

This student conference is a cooperative venture, meant to provide an opportunity for the sharing of research and the collaboration of ideas. As we do not have concurrent sessions, we create an intimate, community environment. This is therefore an excellent conference to begin discussion on emerging research, and we encourage your participation.

We are currently accepting proposals on themes from various disciplinary perspectives (ethics, systematics, history, scripture, philosophy, etc.) in the four areas of comparative theology, interreligious dialogue, theology of religions, and missiology.

In addition, proposals for panels are welcomed. To propose a panel, please submit one proposal for the entire panel, including a brief statement on each presentation.

To submit a proposal, please email an abstract of no more than 250 words to Karen Enriquez at enriquek@bc.edu **before December 1, 2006**. If you already have a complete paper written, feel free to include that in your submission as well. Please include your contact information, your institution and program, and the category into which you are submitting your proposal (panel, comparative theology, interreligious dialogue, theology of religions, or missiology).

Some funds are available for participants to help supplement travel expenses.
