Second, join the Pennsylvania Bar Association, which offers free membership to students who are residents of Pennsylvania or who state a present intent to practice in the state after graduation. Check out the Pennsylvania Bar Association website, www.pabar.org, which offers a Career Center section with job postings appearing under Membership Benefits. There are also numerous local bar associations that you should consider joining, including the Philadelphia Bar Association, www.philabar.org, which offers a free one-year membership once you pass the bar and has an active Young Lawyers Division.

Third, between January and July, you can obtain reciprocity with participating Pennsylvania law schools, which means you can visit their office and look at their job postings. Reciprocity is good for 3 months and expires in August - so if you are planning to study for the Bar in Pennsylvania, contact our office and we can start the reciprocity application process for you.

Fourth, subscribe to legal newspapers, such as *The Legal Intelligencer*, <http://www.law.com/jsp/pa/index.jsp>, *The Philadelphia Lawyer* quarterly magazine and *The Pennsylvania Law Weekly*, <http://www.palawweekly.com>, as well as bar association newsletters.
