James Cheng, is currently serving as the Prospect Data Mining and Modeling Specialist at MIT's Office of Development Services. James was awarded the ERME doctorate in September 2007.

Susan Gracia, received her PhD from ERME in 2001. She is currently an Associate Professor in the Educational Leadership Program and the Director of Assessment at the Feinstein School of Education and Human Development at Rhode Island College.
