

ERME Student Support

Ph.D. students are fully supported by LSOE Graduate Assistantships or Fellowships for their first 2 years in the program. They then typically receive additional support from funded projects for the next 2-3 years of doctoral research.

M.Ed. students are encouraged to apply for a Graduate Assistantship. Teaching and research assistantships are generally reserved for doctoral students, but there are often research assistantships available for master's students.

Lynch School Aid

The Lynch School of Education awards fellowships, assistantships, and/or scholarships to promising doctoral and master's students to aid them in the pursuit of their graduate studies. Examples of awards made are: Graduate Assistantships, Research Assistantships, Teaching Assistantships, Teaching Fellowships, and Dean's Awards (tuition remission awards).

Awards vary by discipline in both nature and size and awards are generally made at the time of admission. A complete admission application qualifies you for consideration of these awards. The scholastic requirements for obtaining these stipend awards are necessarily more exacting than those for simply securing admission to the Graduate School.

An assistantship with a faculty member or administrator usually requires approximately 20 hours of work each week between the months of September and May. The assistantships generally include tuition remission plus a monthly stipend. Doctoral tuition scholarships and stipends are very competitive with other schools. There are a number of half-time assistantships also available.

The greatest number of assistantship opportunities for master's students are in administrative offices both in the Lynch School and across campus. Each year, the admissions office compiles a listing of assistantships, paid internships, and work-study positions both on campus and off-campus. There are a number of academic departments, schools, and organizations with which we have partnerships.
