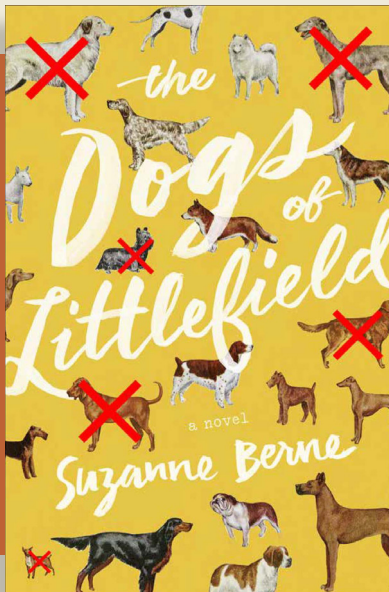


Suzanne Berne AND Christopher Boucher

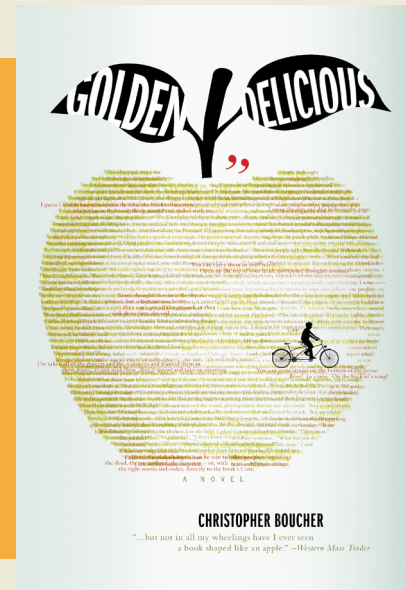
