Over the past year, we have seen an alarming increase in anti-Asian harassment and violence in the United States, including the mass shooting in Atlanta on March 16 that resulted in the murders of six women of Asian descent. To all members of the Carroll School graduate programs community, please remember that we must each take a stand against racism and commit to fostering mutual respect in our daily lives, whether in the classroom, the workplace, or at home.
