Please note that our program provides extensive financial support for our students. Assistantship funding is guaranteed for the first four years of doctoral study and tuition-remission awards are part of all doctoral assistantships. The assistantships during the first four years will include a blend of research, teaching, and some administrative work. An award of a full-time graduate assistantship carries the expectation that the student will be available for 20 hours per week for 9 months. Half-time graduate assistants need to be available 10 hours per week.
