The Lynch School of Education and Human Development (LSEHD) Immigration, Education, and Humanitarian Studies minor consists of 18 credits, 12 of which may not simultaneously be counted towards the BC core or the requirements of any other major or minor. The minor is designed to advance students' understanding of immigration and related educational and humanitarian topics. Students will explore introductory and mastery level coursework, select electives from various departments, and engage in applied action projects and special topics research specially designed every year.
