The Lynch School of Education and Human Development (LSEHD) *Immigration Education and Humanitarian Studies* Minor consists of 18 credits, 12 of which may *not* simultaneously be counted toward the BC core or other major/minor requirements. The minor is designed to advance understanding of immigration and related educational and humanitarian topics. Students will explore introductory and mastery level coursework, select electives from both LSEHD and different Boston College schools and departments and engage in applied action projects and special topics research specially designated each year. Students are encouraged to choose electives from below to curate focal areas and may request approval for other electives not listed below.
