Call for Papers: Author Guidelines

Deadline: October 15, 2018

Presenters whose papers have been accepted are eligible to submit their full paper to be considered for publication.

Submission Information and Deadlines:

All papers, and questions regarding papers, should be sent by October 15, 2018. Authors will be notified by late December, 2018, if their papers have been accepted. There will be three different venues for publication: one volume will include chapters for an audience of SFL researchers (to be published by Equinox), another will have an audience of bilingual and second language researchers (TBA), and the third will be catered to practitioners (TBA). The editorial committee will recommend the specific venue for each accepted paper and confirm decision with author(s).

Paper must be submitted as an e-mail attachment to ISFC2018BC@bc.edu; subject line “Paper Proposal.”

Reviewing:

All papers will be double-blind peer reviewed.

To ensure appropriate double-blind peer review, please follow the following guidelines when submitting your manuscript.

- Include a cover page with the manuscript title, name(s) and affiliation(s) of author(s), and full contact addresses for correspondence (including e-mail).
- In the second page, include the title (but no author identification), and abstract of not more than 150 words, a list of up to 6 key words, and a word count (except tables and figures). Please remove any mention or reference to the author or authors in the manuscript (including references).

Use either American or British spelling consistently within an article.

Exclusions:

- Papers which do not follow the formatting and peer-review guidelines, and/or which are not in the required template will not be considered for publication, and will not be sent for review. This includes papers which are longer than maximum length.

Style and Format:

Your paper must not exceed 8,000 words (about 32 pages), including quotations, references, figures, and tables. It should be typed using Times New Roman Type and double-spaced.

Please submit a copy with author’s information only on the cover page as stated in the earlier instructions. The remainder of the paper to be sent to reviewers shouldn’t include any authors’ names.

Structure of the Paper

Title and Abstract as follows

Abstract

It goes here in 10 point Times New Roman type, double spaced, and should not have more than 200 words

Paper using APA headings as follows,

1	Centered, Boldface, Uppercase and Lowercase Headings
2	Left-aligned, Boldface, Uppercase and Lowercase Heading
3	Indented, boldface, lowercase heading with a period. Begin body text after the period.
4	Indented, boldface, italicized, lowercase heading with a period. Begin body text after the period.
5	<i>Indented, italicized, lowercase heading with a period.</i> Begin body text after the period.

Copyrighted material

You are responsible for securing permission for any copyrighted material that you wish to be included in your paper.

Spelling

You can use British or American spelling, but need to be consistent in your paper. Please also make sure that your paper is free of typographical and linguistic errors.

Images, Figures, and Tables

Add any images, figures and /or tables at the end. Please indicate in the text exactly where and as you want them to appear. Number them and include a caption which explains them following APA title format. For example:

Summary of linguistic theories

Figure 2. Schematic representation of clause

References

References (both in-text and end-of-text) should follow APA 6th style, but do not include the DOI.
