In this seminar students will read narratives by primarily AHANA writers that navigate the complex terrain of race and ethnicity in America. The novels and stories will depict a variety of experiences but suggest that what constitutes an American identity is far from settled. Ethnic difference has a profound effect on personal and social understandings of what it means to be an American. As we discuss the literature, students will be expected to share their own personal narratives of growing up – stories of race, ethnicity, class, gender, faith, and nationality – and what it means to be "ethnic" in America.
