## John Finney

DIRECTOR, THE UNIVERSITY CHORALE OF BOSTON COLLEGE AND THE BOSTON COLLEGE SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA

Now in his twentieth year as director of the University Chorale of Boston College, John Finney has been conductor of the Boston College Symphony Orchestra since 1999. Under his direction, the University Chorale has performed in major world cities, including Berlin, Madrid, Prague, Vienna, and Rome. He has led the Boston College Symphony Orchestra in performances of major works, including symphonies by Beethoven, Tchaikovsky, and Dvorak.

Finney, who holds degrees from the Oberlin College Conservatory of Music and the Boston Conservatory, is associate conductor of Boston's Handel and Haydn Society. He has been the conductor of the Heritage Chorale in Framingham for more than 25 years and has served as director of music at the Wellesley Hills Congregational Church since 1984.

Appointed in 1989 to create performing ensemble opportunities for both accomplished student musicians and developing players, Sebastian Bonaiuto designed and implemented the comprehensive Boston College Bands Program. Some 250 student performers participate in wind bands, jazz ensembles, chamber ensembles, athletic ensembles, and classes at Boston College. Bonaiuto also directs BC bOp!, the instrumental and vocal jazz ensemble, and the University Wind Ensemble.



# THE UNIVERSITY WIND ENSEMBLE OF BOSTON COLLEGE

The mosaic tile seal that serves as Boston College's 150th anniversary logo was laid in a floor at Boston College in the South End of Boston in 1889. Approximately four feet in diameter, it includes elements that remain part of the current seal's design: an interior shield, a cross and the letters IHS flanked by the crowns of St. Botolph's Town (Boston, England), an open book, and the three hills of Boston, Massachusetts. The mosaic was removed to Chestnut Hill and placed in 1995 in Fulton Hall, where it remained until 2010. It will be displayed in a new location during the Sesquicentennial Celebration.
