MAJOR RESEARCH INTERESTS:

I have a disciplinary basis in child psychiatric epidemiology and health and human rights, but my work has relevance to a broad range of disciplines including child development, humanitarian responses, global mental health and implementation science. My primary research interest is to investigate protective processes that contribute to resilient mental health and developmental outcomes in children and adolescents facing adversity in a number of settings and cultures and to use these findings to develop and evaluate mental health and family-based preventive interventions for children and families. The Research Program on Children and Adversity—which I direct at the Boston College School of Social Work—focuses on settings characterized by forms of adversity that define the exceptions to recent improvements in child health globally: regions affected by armed conflict and regions affected by HIV/AIDS. My work emanates from a central set of procedures that I have built and refined over time for designing and evaluating mental health services in diverse cultural settings. This approach formed the core of a Career Development Award (K01) awarded by the National Institute of Mental Health which developed sequenced approaches to mixed methods (quantitative and qualitative research) to arrive at improved cross-cultural mental health assessment of children in a range of diverse cultural settings. These methods have also provided the basis for several of my current research projects which integrate information on local sources of resilience/protective resources into intervention models. As a mental health services researcher, I routinely integrate both qualitative and quantitative data into the development of measures for assessing program impact as well as for identifying the core “active ingredients” of the interventions that I design.

My research is intended to help build the evidence base on mental health and preventive interventions for vulnerable children, youth and families. I have been involved in the adaptation and testing of evidence-based treatments for mental health problems among war-affected youth, including as Co-PI of a randomized controlled trial for the treatment of depression among war-affected youth in northern Uganda which was published in JAMA in 2007. I have also served as PI on an NIMH-funded project to develop and evaluate a family strengthening intervention for HIV-affected families in Rwanda. I have worked with partners to adapt this intervention to focus on families with young children (<3 years) living in extreme poverty and options for delivering such family home visiting interventions via Rwanda's Social Protection system. I am currently PI of an ongoing project to integrate an evidence-based behavioral intervention for war-affected youth (the Youth Readiness Intervention) into education

and employment programs in Sierra Leone and to study barriers and facilitators to taking such interventions to scale via alternate delivery platforms (NIMH U19) linked to World Bank-supported youth employment programs. I am also PI of an NIMHD-funded project using community-based participatory research methods to study conceptualizations of mental health problems as well as attitudes about healing and help-seeking among Somali Bantu and Bhutanese refugee groups in the Boston metropolitan area. This research has led to the design of a family-based preventive interventions to support refugee families navigating new lives in the U.S. The model and a hybrid effectiveness-implementation trial of the intervention was recently awarded funding from the National Institutes of Minority Health and Health Disparities (NIMHD R01). My work to develop a holistic model of child protection—the SAFE model—has led to the development and implementation of SAFE Child Impact Assessments, evaluations of child security that can be conducted in the context of humanitarian emergencies or infrastructure development projects. These tools have been used by several NGOs in India and also for conducting needs assessments of child protection threats in light of the Haiti earthquake of 2010 and for assessing the situation of children affected by HIV in Lesotho.

I also intend for my work to contribute to gaps in our knowledge base about the long-term effects of adversity on child development and mental health. One of my longest standing projects (begun in 2002) is a prospective longitudinal/intergenerational study of war-affected youth in Sierra Leone. A current NICHD R01 research grant is supporting a fourth wave of data collection in the cohort to investigate the intergenerational effects of war in Sierra Leone by examining health and development of the young children of the original cohort as well as intimate partner relationships and long-term mental health outcomes and community relationships. This research comprises one of the few intergenerational studies of war ever conducted in sub-Saharan Africa. As these projects indicate, I am committed to translational research that proposes sustainable interventions for use in communities characterized by extreme resource constraints. In this light, my intervention research is oriented towards examination of task-shifting to well-trained and supervised community health workers and mechanisms or enhancing fidelity and overcoming barriers to agency buy-in of evidence-based practices, training and supervision structures and the cost-effectiveness and impact of investments in global mental health and family-based prevention initiatives. Finally, I am interested in developing intervention research studies that examine explicitly the mechanisms of intervention effectiveness in order to better target the most active ingredients of intervention design in resource-constrained settings and to arrive at transdiagnostic mental health interventions which can target several domains of mental health distress and functional impairment.

African Youth Psychosocial Assessment (AYPA)	The AYPAs are a dimensional measure of child and adolescent emotional and behavioral problems. Developed using qualitative data collected among children and youth in northern Uganda, this locally-derived scale comprises 40 items and has demonstrated strong internal, inter-rater, and test-retest reliability. The AYPAs are innovative in its mixed-methods application of qualitative and quantitative techniques for assessing mental health constructs in non-Western field settings. Researchers working in other sub-Saharan settings are beginning to use the AYPAs, underscoring the AYPAs' potential for making a major impact on the field of child mental health in sub-Saharan Africa.
SAFE Framework	The SAFE model is a rights-based, holistic framework for examining four fundamental and interrelated domains of children's security: S afety/protection, A ccess to health care and basic physiological needs, F amily/connection to others, and E ducation/economic security. This model emphasizes the interdependence of children's survival needs, and accounts for the survival strategies (dangerous and adaptive) that children and families employ to cope with deficits in any core domain.
SAFE Child Impact Assessment (SCIA)	The SCIA is a tool for assessing and/or anticipating how an event of intervention affects: a) the four fundamental domains of security outlined by the SAFE framework; b) the interdependence of these domains; and c) the survival strategies that children and families use to cope with insecurity in any domain. Within a given context, a SCIA can be used to illuminate how the public and private sectors, as well as civil society, may work together to ensure the security and well-being of vulnerable children and families. The SCIA is divided into four chapters: 1) background, purpose, and need for conducting the SCIA; 2) methodology used to complete the SCIA; 3) findings organized by the SAFE model domains; and 4) conclusions,

recommendations, and next steps. A SCIA template and manual have been developed to guide completion of the assessment.
