# Admission Agreement <br> Between Boston College Woods College of Advancing Studies and North Shore Community College 

Trustees of Boston College, 140 Commonwealth Avenue, Chestnut Hill, MA 02467 ("Boston College") and North Shore Community College, 1 Ferncroft Road, Danvers, MA 01923, ("NSCC"), do hereby enter into this Admission Agreement ("Agreement") on the date that this Agreement is signed by the authorized administrative representatives of both institutions.

WHEREAS, Boston College and North Shore Community College have long standing traditions of excellence in education; and

WHEREAS, Boston College and NSCC believe it is desirable to complement the missions of both institutions by facilitating the application to, admission to, and completion of the Wood College of Advancing Studies bachelor of arts (BA) degree offered through Boston College Woods College of Advancing Studies ("Woods College") for qualified NSCC students.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and mutual covenants contained herein, Boston College and NSCC agree as follows:

## Section 1: Eligible Students under this Agreement

1. This Agreement applies to qualified NSCC students who have graduated from OR who are on track to graduate at the conclusion of the current semester from NSCC's degree programs as outlined in Appendix A (attached hereto).
2. Qualified NSCC students must meet the following criteria:
i. Be a student in good standing with an anticipated successful completion of an Associate's degree from NSCC at the conclusion of current semester. "Good standing" is defined by maintenance of a sustained trajectory toward completion of study without any current impediment to graduation and a Dean's clearance with regard to disciplinary and conduct related records. Any violations of good standing would require full explanation;
ii. A minimum overall Grade Point Average ("GPA") of 2.5 at NSCC, and
iii. Submission of an abbreviated Woods College BA program application materials by the published deadline for entry into the intended term. The abbreviated application requires an official NSCC transcript that shows either proof of degree conferral or enrollment in their last semester before completion.
3. NSCC students who do not meet the qualifications contained herein may apply for admission to the Woods College BA program via the standard process, and will not receive the benefits outlined in this Agreement.
4. Regarding the Woods College BA program, qualified graduating NSCC students are eligible for:
i. A waiver of the application fee;
ii. A waiver of the letters of recommendation and essays required for application
iii. Use of attestation form verifying high school completion in lieu of official high school transcripts, and
iv. Guaranteed admission into Woods College BA program.
5. Potential applicants with questions about the Woods College BA degree should be referred to the Woods College Admissions Office, wcasadm@bc.edu.

## Section 2: Financial Aid / Scholarship Opportunities

1. Students eligible to attend through this articulation agreement will be eligible to receive financial assistance through the Financial Aid Office at Boston College. Students must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the Boston College New Student Application for Financial Aid to determine scholarship, grant, and loan eligibility.
2. As of spring 2022, Woods College may provide up to 5 Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) scholarships for qualified applicants (depending on funding availability) each semester. Scholarships are equivalent to tuition for one class. NSCC students who would like to be considered for an award, must submit their PTK certificate as well as a letter of interest to wcasadm@bc.edu by December 1 (spring semester applicants), April 1 (summer term applicants), or July 1 (fall semester applicants). NSCC counselors will share PTK scholarship information with all eligible PTK students and/or share contact information of students with BC representatives, who will forward scholarship information.

## Section 3: Effective Dates and Termination of the Agreement

1. This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement and understanding between Boston College and North Shore Community College with respect to its subject matter. This Agreement becomes effective on the date that it is signed by the authorized administrative representatives of both institutions and is valid for a period of three (3) years. No prior or contemporaneous agreement or understanding will be effective.
2. Each party will evaluate, determine, and notify the other party no later than March 1st, 2026 as to whether or not a renewal of this Agreement is desired.
3. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon written notice to the other party with at least ninety (90) days prior notice or, if a violation of the agreement occurs, this Agreement may be terminated upon written notice. Termination shall be without penalty. If this Agreement is terminated, neither North Shore Community College nor Boston College shall be liable to the other for any monetary or other losses that may result.
4. This agreement is not assignable and may not be amended, revised or modified, except in writing executed by all parties. If the agreement is terminated for any reason prior to the end
of the effective period, NSCC students who were accepted into or enrolled in the articulated program prior to the termination of this agreement will be able to complete the degree program.

## Section 4: Dispute Resolution

In the event of a conflict or dispute pertaining to the terms of this Agreement, the parties agree to use their best efforts to resolve their differences in good faith.

## Section 4: Agreement Management/Administration

1. It is agreed and understood that each party has the right and responsibility to make changes to its curricula and enrollment standards to maintain its academic integrity and meet accreditation standards. To the extent that any such changes will directly affect this Agreement, such changes will be communicated in writing between the parties as they occur.
2. Each institution will maintain and control the academic records of its matriculated students. Access to grades and other student information will be controlled in accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, and Massachusetts law, in each case as amended.
3. Boston College retains the sole authority to maintain and enforce its academic standards and policies. North Shore Community College students matriculating at Boston College are expected to adhere to all applicable Boston College standards and policies, and nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to guarantee that any individual student will complete Boston College academic requirements or earn a Boston College degree.
4. It is understood that this agreement in no way implies the provision of housing for admitted students. The Woods College BA Program does not have residential options for students.
5. The agreement should be posted on both institutions' websites and included in appropriate marketing/admission materials. BCWCAS and NSCC agree to collaborate in the areas of publicity, marketing, recruitment, curriculum, and transfer efforts as follows:
a. All announcements, publicity, marketing, and recruitment activities by either institution relative to the articulation agreement will be done following a plan collaboratively developed and agreed to by both parties.
b. Faculty and staff at both institutions will share information in this agreement with interested and qualified students, and both institutions will provide counseling and advising to current and prospective students.
c. This agreement may be publicized to the campus community, catalog, website, publications and newsletters by both schools.

## Section 5: Non-Discrimination; Benefit; Governing Law

1. Boston College and North Shore Community College will each adhere to its respective institution's non-discrimination policy and comply with all applicable laws in its activities hereunder.
2. Boston College and North Shore Community College will not discriminate against any students or employees in connection with this Program on the basis of race, religion, color, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, age, national or ethnic origin, disability or veteran status or any other basis prohibited by law.
3. This Agreement is intended solely for the benefit of Boston College and North Shore Community College. There is no intention to create any rights or interest for any party or person other than Boston College or North Shore Community College.
4. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, with regard to its conflict of law principles.

## Section 6: Name and Logo Use; Media

1. North Shore Community College shall not use the names "Boston College" or "Woods College of Advancing Studies", or the name of any school or division thereof, or any logo or insignia of Boston College or of any school or division thereof, or otherwise identify Boston College or any school or division thereof, in any form of publicity or disclosure (other than referencing Boston College in promoting this program to its students and prospective students as provided in Section 1 above) without the prior written consent of Boston College, which shall be at Boston College's complete and uncontrolled discretion at any time or times. Any request for name use shall be directed to the designated contact listed below.
2. Boston College shall not use the name "North Shore Community College", or the name of any school or division thereof, or any logo or insignia of North Shore Community College or of any school or division thereof, or otherwise identify North Shore Community College or any school or division thereof, in any form of publicity or disclosure (other than referencing North Shore Community College in promoting this program) without the prior written consent of North Shore Community College, which shall be at NSCC's complete and uncontrolled discretion at any time or times. Any request for name use shall be directed to Dr. Kathryn Nielsen, Senior Executive Officer
3. Neither party shall communicate with members of the media or otherwise make any public announcement regarding this Agreement, without the prior written consent of the other party. Any inquiries from the media shall be referred to Dr. Kathryn Nielsen, Senior Executive Officer at North Shore Community College or Boston College's Associate Vice President, University Communications.
4. The parties recognize and acknowledge that all rights and goodwill in their respective trademarks and other intellectual property are the exclusive property of their separate
organizations. Except as set forth above, the parties agree not to use the other's name or other trademarks in advertising, marketing or other materials without the prior written permission of the other.

## Section 7: Miscellaneous

1. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties relating to the matters set forth herein. Except as expressly provided herein, this Agreement supersedes all prior communications, oral or written, between Boston College and North Shore Community College regarding the subject matter hereof.

4. Boston College and North Shore Community College acknowledge that the individuals authorized to receive notice are not authorized to change the terms of this Agreement.

5. No party may assign or delegate this Agreement or any rights, duties, or obligations hereunder to any other person or entity.
