Marine Captain Robert P. Rumley Jr., 25, of 25 Englehardt rd., Medford, died Saturday at Faulkner Hospital of injuries suffered in Vietnam in Sept. 1966.

Capt Rumley was injured when the helicopter in which he was riding was shot down during "Operation Hastings."

Since then he has been in the Balboa Hospital, Vietnam, Chelsea Naval and Shattuck Hospitals.

He was born in Winchester, graduated from Medford High School in 1960, Huntington School for Boys in 1961 and from Boston College in 1965.

He entered the Marine Corps after receiving his degree in business administration and was attached to the First Marine Division in Vietnam since August, 1966.
