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Title: Affordable Housing in America: Policy Responses to Affordable Housing Demands

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The Urban Land Institute projects that minorities will account for 88% of household growth in America's housing market by 2030. The average minorities' net worth in America, however, is 10–13 times less than the white average. With significantly lower income, renting may be their only housing option. Unaffordable housing and rental markets will only exacerbate the economic inequality faced by this demographic, forcing a large population of immigrants and citizens to forego nutritious food, medical help, and other family essentials.
