SUPPORT FOR INTERNATIONAL AND UNDOCUMENTED STUDENTS AT BOSTON COLLEGE

Boston College is committed to providing a safe and supportive environment for all of its students. In fulfillment of that commitment, Boston College will:

- In accordance with the Family Educational Right to Privacy Act (FERPA), continue its policy of maintaining confidentiality of all students' personal records, unless required to provide information by warrant.
- Continue protecting the rights of all in the Boston College community by requiring law enforcement agencies to make prior notification before conducting investigations on campus.
- Provide legal advice for undocumented students through the Boston College Law School's Center for Human Rights and International Justice at humanrights@bc.edu.
- Provide counseling support for students through University Counseling Services.
- Offer special pastoral care for undocumented students through Campus Ministry.

Students with concerns related to their status can also seek additional assistance through the divisions of University Mission and Ministry and Student Affairs.

International students with concerns regarding visa matters can obtain support and suggestions about legal assistance from the Office of International Students and Scholars (OISS).
