Do you want to get royalty money from your research?

Then please tell us your invention!

- The mission of Office of Technology Transfer & Licensing (OTTL) is to protect BC's intellectual property, assist faculty and students in commercializing their innovative ideas, and bring in licensing royalty sharing with inventors.
- If you feel your research has any commercial value (or not sure), please contact us.
- Please send your invention disclosure form (IDF) to us for evaluation **before** any public disclosure, which includes books, peer reviewed publications, awarded grants, published abstracts, catalogued dissertations and theses, online publication before in print, posters, websites, and presentations/seminars given at conferences, other universities, and companies.

- If you disclose your invention **before** the patent filing, you will lose your international patent rights permanently.
- According to the new Patent Law --- America Invents Act (AIA), the U.S. has moved to a first inventor-to-file system, so plan to file early.
- Please contact OTTL **immediately** if you are about to publish or have published your paper(s) within one year.
