Etty is a 50-minute play drawn from the diaries of Etty Hillesum, a sensuous, intelligent, and poetic young Dutch Jewish woman searching for the meaning of her life – and all life – during the terror of Nazi occupation. In the midst of two separate love affairs, she "happens upon" prayer, discovers a reality that she calls God, and opens herself to the power of love that heals and reconciles those around her.



Susan Stein enacts *Etty's* powerful poetic prose. She studied acting at NYU Graduate School and SUNY Purchase. She has appeared in major productions. Austin Pendleton, who directs, is an acclaimed American film (*My Cousin Vinny*, *Finding Nemo*), television (*The West Wing*, *Oz*), and stage actor, playwright, theatre director, and teacher.
