Policy regarding transfer of credit for students transferring to Boston College Law School.

Students who have completed a full year (or its equivalent) at an ABA approved law school are eligible to apply to transfer to Boston College Law School's J.D. program.

Students who are admitted as transfer students should note the following:

Boston College Law School (BC Law) will accept up to 33 credit hours in transfer. For required courses, BC Law will accept the actual number of credits that the student earned at the previous law school, even if these differ from the number of credits BC Law awards for its equivalent courses.

Transfer students' BC transcripts will display their prior courses and the number of credits accepted but not the grades earned at the prior law school. Their BC grade point averages will reflect only grades earned at BC Law.

Accepted transfer students are expected to take four semesters in residence at BC Law.

Students who transfer into BC Law are eligible to participate in the student law journals and the UCC Reporter Digest.

Students who transfer into BC Law are eligible to graduate with Latin honors but are not eligible for membership in the Boston College Law School's chapter of Order of the Coif, which requires six semesters of attendance at BC Law.
