

Amendment Update


- □ Bishop Peterson Hall and Library Amendment was filed on October 12, 2007

 - Church in the 21st Century Center (Distance Learning)
- □ Kitchen Used jointly by St. John's Seminary and BC






BISHOP PETERSON HALL









SAINT JOHN'S SEMINARY

- □ Creating one of the largest and most comprehensive collections of Roman Catholic theological works in the U.S.






LIBRARY

- Seek approval to use Library for shared St. John's Seminary and BC School of Theology and Ministry


□ St. William's Hall Program Change

- □ 4 Houses visited more than once
- □ 5 Houses were Non-BC Residents



Example of a Repeat Offender

□ 62 + 64 Kirkwood Road

- Joint basement converted into "Club Kirkwood"
- Underage drinking and excessive noise
- Exposed wiring and egress issues
- No smoke or carbon monoxide detectors

□ Actions Taken

- Parties disbanded by BC & Boston Police
- ISD inspected for code violations & BC attended code violation hearing
- Landlord resolved violations
 - □ Relocated 5 students after the attics & basement were condemned as living spaces
 - □ Placed a divider wall in basement
 - ☐ Installed smoke & carbon monoxide detectors
 - ☐ Fixed wiring and egress issues
- Parents met with their sons about their behavior

□ No incidents in the past 4 weeks

 Provides academically talented students from Allston/Brighton the financial support to attend Boston College

□ Award Eligibility:

- permanent resident of Allston-Brighton for a minimum of four years
- accepted for freshman admission at Boston College
- completed the Boston College financial application process and have an institutionally determined need of greater than \$10,000

- □ The selection process
 - completed by BC's Office of Undergraduate Admission
 - no application form required

- Scholarship recipients
 - receive full tuition for four years
 - scholarship renews annually

- □ 2007-2008 academic year: 7 scholarships were awarded to Allston-Brighton students:
 - Su Yu, Boston Latin School, Allston
 - Bilal Ahmed, Boston Latin School, Brighton
 - Rachel Buckley, Ursuline Academy, Brighton
 - Nairobi Oller, Brighton High School, Brighton
 - Tara Prince, Boston Latin School, Brighton
 - Colby Riordan, Boston Latin School, Brighton
 - Jennifer Hartin, Boston Latin School, Brighton.

☐ If all 10 scholarships are not awarded to Allston/Brighton students, then the remaining scholarships are awarded to admitted students who reside in other neighborhoods of Boston
