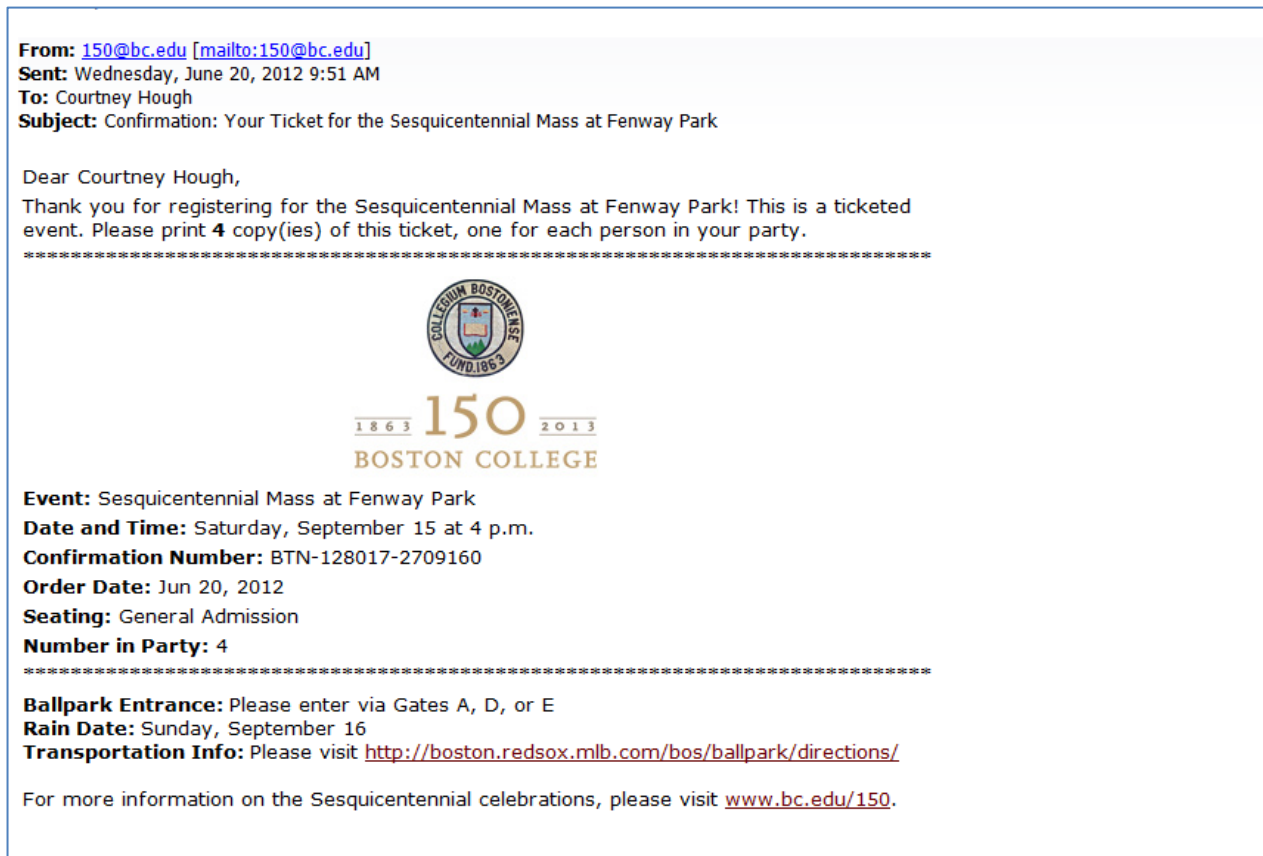
Event: Sesquicentennial Mass at Fenway Park

Time: 4PM, gates open at 3PM

Date: Saturday, Sept 15 (rain date: Sunday, Sept 16)

How do I register?

Guests may register by going to www.bc.edu/150 and click on “Mass at Fenway Park” under Events, then click “Register Online”. The registrant will receive a confirmation email that will act as their ‘ticket’ for entry. It looks like this:



What's the timeline?

The gates open at 3 p.m. with the Mass beginning at 4 p.m. The general reception following the Mass will take place from 5:30 to 7 p.m.

How many guests may I bring?

There's no limit, but please register them all online for attendance purposes. Guests do not need to be directly affiliated with BC.

I registered, but need to add a guest.

Each guest needs a confirmation email 'ticket' to enter. If you would like to add a guest, you can register them, individually, online and receive an additional ticket.

Who is invited?

All of the BC community -- students, faculty, staff, alumni, parents and friends. Members of the Jesuit Communities and alumni priests will be invited to concelebrate the Mass. Boston College High School will co-sponsor of the Mass.

If I also received an invitation from BC High, with whom should I register?

You can register with either school, but please only register once.

Where do I park?

Some parking lots close to Fenway will be open, but public transportation is highly recommended. Please refer to the transportation information on the Fenway website. <http://boston.redsox.mlb.com/bos/ballpark/directions/>

Boston College Students- BC will provide buses for students. These buses will provide round-trip transportation. More information will be given closer the event date.

Where do I enter the ball park?

The confirmation ticket indicates that guests should enter via Gate A, D, or E.

Seating?

General Admission—first come, first served. No reserved seating.

Seating

Seating for the Mass at Fenway is on a first-come, first-served basis. The gates will open at 3:00 p.m.

Upon entering the park, Fenway ushers will assist guests in wheelchairs to the designated areas throughout the park.

For elderly guests, most of the seating sections are accessible via ramps or elevators. You should also arrive early for the best seating options should someone in your party need a seat at the end of an aisle.

Other

Some have asked about seats with padding. Please note that you should plan on bringing a seat cushion should you need one, as there are no seats available with padding in the stands.

What happens after the Mass?

Guests will be able to walk around the perimeter of the field, take pictures with the World Series trophies, and take photos with Wally.

Ballpark concession stands will be open.
